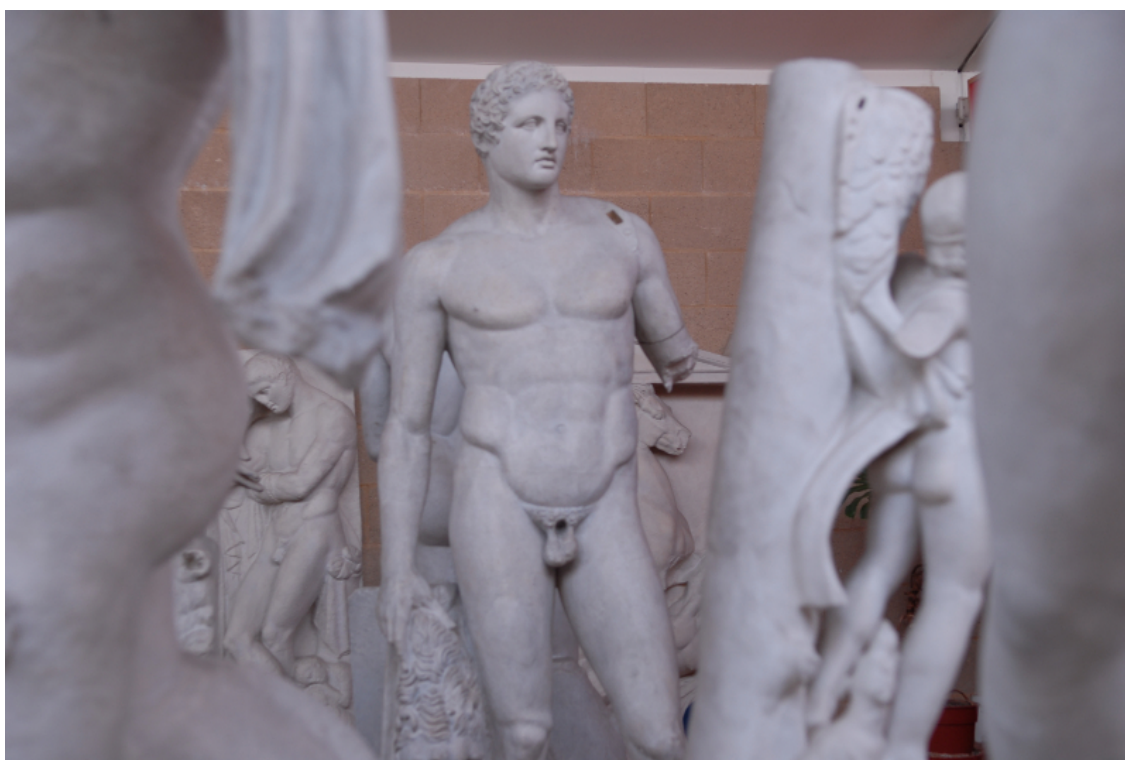

The Gods of the Parthenon: 3D

Visit Bay B for our new temporary display, curated by Rui Nakamura of Kochi University and Tokyo University of the Arts. This display explores the gods represented on the Parthenon frieze from a new perspective, by encouraging us to see them as fully-realised three-dimensional figures. The twelve Olympian gods from the frieze are visualised in miniature form, hand-carved and displayed in a semi-circle as if they watch the Panathenaic procession unfolding before them.
