

## The Sixty-second meeting.

The sixty-second meeting was held on Monday, January 21<sup>st</sup>, 1946 at 8.30 p.m. in 'Dr. Eden's rooms' in Trinity Hall. The meeting was convened to discuss the question of reviving the Club after the long ~~suspension~~ of its activities during the war.

Professor Hackforth accordingly opened the meeting with a statement of the history, aims & shortcomings of the Club as it had been in the years from 1932 to 1939. It was unanimously decided that the Club should be revived. Professor Hackforth then stated that neither he nor Mr. Angus wished to be considered for election to the presidency of the Club & proposed instead Mr. R. L. Howland. The nomination was seconded. Mr. Howland's Daipur assented, & he was duly elected. Mr. C. F. Angus was again elected Treasurer & Mr. J. E. Raven - the dissent of his Daipur being overruled - assumed the office of Secretary.

Henceforth Mr. Howland took the chair. It was

agreed that the next meeting should be held on Monday, February 4<sup>th</sup>, but that ~~the date of~~ the second meeting of the term should, if possible, be held on some other day of the week since meetings of the Union were now held on Mondays. The President himself agreed to read a paper at the first meeting, & Mr. G. S. Kirk at the second. It was agreed that there should be coffee before the first meeting.

There was a considerable amount of discussion concerning the lines upon which the Club should henceforth be run. The following suggestions were made for future consideration:

- 1) That a committee of 3 junior members should be elected to ensure that the officers fulfilled their proper functions.
- 2) That there should be two meetings in both the Michaelmas & Lent Terms & one only in the Easter Term.
- 3) That distinguished outsiders should be only occasionally be invited to read papers, & not at all for the time being.

- 4) That the Club should exist primarily for discussion  
→ the length of papers should be normally restricted to about 20 minutes.
- 5) That papers on any subject of interest to those reading Part B, & perhaps also debates, should be included in the programme.
- 6) That if there were on any occasion no volunteers to read papers at subsequent meetings the question might be decided by lot.

It was agreed that no card should be printed for the current term but that a list of members should be included in the minutes. The following expressed their desire to become members:
