

CREWS PhD Studentship – Guidance for Completing the Cambridge Graduate Admission and Scholarship Application Form (GRADSAF)

When applying for PhDs at Cambridge, applications are normally submitted centrally to the Graduate Admissions Office. However, due to the specific nature of the CREWS Research Project, this award will be administered directly by the Faculty of Classics. When completing your Graduate Admission and Scholarship Application Form (GRADSAF), please use the guidance on the CREWS Studentship page of the Faculty website, rather than any other guidance that you may find elsewhere.

Points to note when completing the GRADSAF:

- Section A(1): Personal Details (page 1)
 Please enter your full name as it appears on your passport. If your name has changed recently, please provide documentation so that we can easily match your references with your application.
- Section A(3) Programme of Study (page 1)
 Your application is for a 3-year, full-time PhD in Classics, starting in October 2016 (do not worry about the course code).
- Section A(12) Summary details of research proposal or reason for applying for the course (page 4) Please leave this section blank, and include a separate research proposal.
- Section B Application for Funding (page 5)
 Please leave this section blank, as above. All other funding deadlines have now passed.
- Fee of £100 (page 10)

 Thanks to a dispensation from Graduate Admissions, this fee has been reduced to £50 and will be applicable to the successful candidate only.

No payment is required at the application stage.
