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λαπάρη ης *Ion.f.* [λαπαρός] soft part of the body between ribs and hip (esp. as vulnerable to injury), **flank**, **side** *Il. Hdt. AR.*

λαπαρός ἄ ὄν *adj.* (of a hare's flanks) **supple** *X.*

Λαπίθαι ὦν (ep. ἄων, dial. ἄν) *m.pl.* **Lapiths** (ancient Thessalian tribe, noted for their battle with the Centaurs) *Hom. Hes. Pi. E. Isoc. AR. + || SG.* (as proper name) Lapithes (ancestor of the Lapiths) *Hes.fr. Call.*; (as ethnic name, ref. to one who is descended fr. the tribe) Lapith *Hdt.*

λάπτω *vb.* | fut. λάψω | (of wolves) **lap up** —water (*W.DAT. w. their tongues*) *Il.*

λαρινός ἡ ὄν *adj.* (of a bull, an ox) **fattened**, **fatted** *Xenoph. Ar.*; (fig., of a speech) *Ar.*

λαρίσο-ποιοί ὦν *m.pl.* [Λάρισσα *Larisa* (city in Thessaly), ποιέω] **makers of cauldrons of the Larisaean type** *Arist.(quot. Gorg.)*

λαρκίδιον ον *n.* [dimin. λάρκος] container (envisaged as a child), **dear little basket** *Ar.*

λάρκος ον *m.* container (for carrying charcoal and other goods), **basket** *Ar.*

λάρναξ ακος *f.* **1** storage-container, **chest**, **box** *Il. B. Hdt. Theoc. Plu.*

2 container for the bones of a cremated corpse; **casket** (of gold) *Il.*; **coffin** (of wood) *Th.*

3 chest (in which a person is set adrift on the sea) *Hes.fr. Simon. AR.*; (in which a person is imprisoned) *Theoc.*

λάρος ον *m.* seagull *Od. Ar.*; (exemplifying greed and thievishness, fig.ref. to a person) *Ar.*

λαρός ὄν *adj.* | superl. λαρώτατος | **1** pleasant to the senses; (of a meal, wine) **pleasing**, **delicious** *Hom. AR.*; (of blood, to a mosquito) *Il.*; (of the scent of meadow-grass, to a bull) *Mosch.*

2 (of a word, spoken by a girl in love) **sweet** *AR.*

λαρυγγίζω *vb.* [λάρυγξ] | fut. λαρυγγίω | **1** (of a person) make a full-throated noise, **bellow** *D.*

2 throttle, strangle (or perh. out-bellow) —politicians *Ar.*

λάρυγξ υγγος *m.* larynx (upper part of the windpipe); (gener.) throat *E.Cyc. Ar.*

λασάμενος (dial.aor.mid.ptcpl.): see λανθάνω

λάσανα ὦν *n.pl.* supports for holding cooking-pots over a fire, **pot-props** *Ar.*

λάσδεο (dial.pres.mid.imperatv.): see λάζομαι

λασεῦμαι (dial.fut.mid.), **λάσσην** (Aeol.fut.inf.): see λανθάνω

λασθαίνω *vb.* [λάσθη] **insult**, **mock** —someone *Hippon.*

λάσθη ης *f.* **insult**, **mockery** *Hdt.*

λασθήμεν (dial.aor.pass.inf.): see λανθάνω

λασι-αύχην ενος *masc.fem.adj.* [λάσιος, αύχήν] **1** (of a Centaur, bear, horse) having a shaggy neck, **shaggy-maned** *hHom. S.*; (of a lion-skin) *Theoc.*

2 (of the hair of Aeschylus, envisaged as a wild beast) **on a shaggy neck** *Ar.*

λάσιος ᾱ (*Ion. η*) ὄν *adj.* **1** covered thickly with hair; (of a sheep, its belly) **woolly** *Hom. Theoc.*; (of other animals, parts of their bodies) **hairy**, **shaggy** *Hdt. S. Pl. X. Theoc.*; (of bees) *Theoc.*

2 (of Silenos, the Cyclops, his eyebrow) **hairy**, **shaggy** *Call. Theoc.*; (of a person, their head) *Ar. Pl.*; (of a warrior's chest) *Il.*; (of a warrior's heart, as being in such a chest) *Il.*

3 (of hair on a giant's chest, on a person's head) **shaggy** *Call. Plu.*; (of a horse's mane) *AR.*; (of goatskin thongs) *Plu.*

4 covered thickly with foliage; (of trees, branches, a copse) **thickly leaved**, **leafy** *Hellenist.poet.*; (of ground, pasture, a hillside) **overgrown**, **bushy**, **wooded** *Pl. X. AR. Plu.*; (of the primeval earth) *Emp.* || *NEUT.PL.SB.* thick undergrowth *X.*

(w.pres.sens.) λέλακα, *Ion. λέληκα*, ep.fem.ptcpl. λελακυῖα || *MID.*: 3pl.ep.redupl.aor. λελάκοντο | **1** (of things) make a sharp sound; (of weapons and armour) **ring** (w. blows) *Il.*; (of bones struck in battle) **crack** *Il.*; (of a burning forest) **crackle** *Hes.*; (of the hubs of chariot wheels) **squeal**, **screech** *A.*

2 (of animals) give a shrill or rasping cry; (of a bird in pursuit of its prey, or caught by a predator) **shriek**, **scream** *Il. Hes.*; (of a girl, envisaged as an owl) **screech** *Alcm.*; (of a woman, envisaged as a dog) **yelp**, **yap** *Semon.*; (of Scylla) *Od.* || *MID.* (of dogs) **bark** *hHom.*

3 (of persons) **shriek**, **shout**, **cry out** —*W.COGN.ACC.* a shout, a cry of triumph *A. E.*; (of a land) —*W.NEUT.ADV.* in lamentation *A.*; (of singers, Echo) **raise a cry** *E.*

4 (of gods, prophets, messengers, or sim.) speak with authority, **shrill forth**, **proclaim** *A. Ar.(mock-trag.)*

—*W.INTERN.ACC.* an oracular message, a lie, disaster, or sim. *Trag. Ar.* —*W.ACC. + INF.* that sthg. is or will be the case *A. S.*

λάσταυρος ον *m.* (pejor.) passive male homosexual, **pathic**, **pervert** *Men. Plb.(quot.)*

λάταγες ὦν *f.pl.* last drops of wine (thrown fr. a cup, in the game of κότταβος) *Alc. Call.*

Λατογενής *dial.adj.*, **Λατογένεια** *dial.fem.adj.*: see under Λητώ

Λατοιδᾶς *dial.m.*: see Λητοίδης, under Λητώ

λατομέω *contr.vb.* [λάας, τέμνω] **hew out** —a tomb (*W. ἐν + DAT.* in a rock) *NT.* || *PASS.* (of a tomb) be hewn —*W. ἐκ + GEN.* out of a rock *NT.*

λατομίαι ὦν *f.pl.* stone-quarries *Plu.*

λατρεία ᾱς *f.* [λατρεύω] **1** condition of owing service (to someone); (pejor.) **subservience**, **servitude** (to a divine or human master) *A. S. Plu.*; **domestic service** (by a wife) *Plu.* || *PL.* acts of servility *Plu.*

2 (with neutral or positive connot.) **service** (performed for a god, by a cup-bearer or temple-attendant) *E.*; (gener.) **service**, **devotion** (to a god) *Pl.*; (to God) *NT.* || *PL.* acts of service (to the gods) *Pl.*

λατρεῦμα ατος *n.* **1** || *PL.* acts of servitude (to a human master) *S.*

2 || *PL.* acts of service (to a god, by worshippers, ref. to offerings) *E.*

3 (ref. to a person) **slave** *E.*

λατρεύω *vb.* [λάτρον] **1** perform servile labour, **work as or like a slave** *Sol. X.* —*W.DAT.* for someone *S. E.* —*W.COGN.ACC.* in inglorious servitude *Plu.*; (fig.) **be a slave** —*W.DAT.* to sufferings *S.* —to beauty *Isoc.*; (of Prometheus) —to a rock *A.*; (wkr.sens.) **serve**, **be a devoted servant of** —*W.DAT.* the laws *X.*

2 (of a temple-attendant) **serve** (sts. *W.DAT.* a god) *E.*

—*W.COGN.ACC.* w. fine toil *E.*; (of female slaves) **serve**, **wait upon** —*W.ACC.* a priestess and her altars *E.*

3 worship (sts. *W.DAT.* God) *NT.*

λάτριος ᾱ ὄν *adj.* **1** (of a wage) **for menial services** *Pi.*

2 (predic., of a city, being handed over) **for servitude**, **into slavery** *Pi.*

λάτρις ιος *m.f.* **1** hired servant; **hireling**, **servant** (in a household, or of an individual, sts. derog. or ref. to a slave) *Thgn. S. E. Arist.(quot.trag.) Call.*; (of an army, ref. to a messenger) *E.*; **servant**, **attendant** (of a god, in a temple) *E.*;
