

The Craven, Prendergast and Henry Arthur Thomas Studentships and the Charles Oldham Classical and George Charles Winter Warr Scholarships: Notice

Applications are invited for these Studentships and Scholarships, to which elections will be made either during the Easter Term 2014 or during the Research Period 2014 for the 2014/15 academical year. A Student or Scholar is eligible for re-election on not more than two occasions.

Candidature for the Studentships or Scholarship shall be open to any person who is or is about to be registered as a Graduate Student in the Faculty of Classics in the University. Election to and tenure of the Studentship or Scholarship shall lapse if the person elected does not become or ceases to be a registered Graduate Student.

The Studentship or Scholarship shall be tenable from the date on which the student comes into residence during the 2014/15 academical year until 30 September 2015.

All those who apply for an MPhil or PhD place in the Faculty of Classics (for entry in 2014/15) by 10 January 2014 will be considered automatically for these studentships and scholarships, and awards are normally made in the summer when candidates' final undergraduate or master's examination results are known.

Other candidates for any of these Studentships for 14/15 (i.e. those who will be in a second or subsequent year of a PhD course in 2014/15) must submit their application on the appropriate form available online from:

Applications must be sent to the Academic Secretary (Graduate) of the Faculty Board of Classics (c/o the Chief Secretary) so as to reach him not later than 5 pm on Friday 10 January 2014.

The **Craven Studentship** is for a course of advanced study or research in the languages, literature, philosophy, history, archaeology, or art of ancient Greece or Rome, or the comparative philology of the Indo-European languages. The Managers may waive the normal requirement that the course must involve absence from Cambridge for not less than six months.

The **Prendergast Studentship** is for study or research in the language, literature, history, philosophy, archaeology, or art of ancient Greece, according to a course proposed by the Student and approved by the Electors. The Electors may waive the normal requirement that some considerable portion of the year shall be spent away from Cambridge.

The **Henry Arthur Thomas Studentship** is for a course of advanced study or research in the archaeology, art, history, language, law, literature, or philosophy of ancient Greece or Rome, or the comparative philology of the Indo-European languages.

The **Charles Oldham Classical Scholarship** is for advanced study or research in connection with some classical author or authors.

The **George Charles Winter Warr Scholarship** is for classical research.

Emoluments will be paid in three termly instalments.
